A: One of the options is to use WINEPREFIX or WINEARCH directory for installing your program. wine --help tells about the options and parameters: WINEPREFIX Define WINEPREFIX before installation WINEARCH Installer selects the subdirectory of WINEPREFIX for the WINEARCH variable if WINEARCH is not set. So, wineprefix to where you keep your application: /home//.wine And then remove the entry of the wine application directory, such as : cd ~ rm -R.wine There are other options as well for this task, just man wine for more info. All for the benefit of Windows exe which are just converted to a.DLL or.SO version for the sake of Win/Mac compatibility. A: You can install WINE as follows: sudo apt-get update sudo apt-get install wine After that, you can run your applications. Q: Exception dialog with Wicket label I am working on web app that needs to handle many error situations, and the user should be notified of the error in a dialog similar to JSF's faces-config.xml, with a "more details" button that leads to a simple page with more details. I am using Wicket, so I don't have access to the FacesContext or the com.sun.faces.context.PartialViewContext. It also doesn't seem to support the construction of the alert and the redirect to a new page. So now I am working with the following: throw new Exception("message", e); Which will display the default error page, while we have a simple "More info" button on top of it. If this is clicked, it goes to a new page with an alert displaying the message. Now, I would like to also show the message in the dialog that was shown, so my solution is: protected void onException(AjaxRequestTarget target, Exception e) { target.appendJavaScript("alert('" + e.getMessage() + "')"); } That works, it shows the message, but then it's gone and we get the default
